## Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE) Win Top Competition for Second Year

Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE) is a non-profit organization present on college campuses across the world. SIFE works to empower students with the skills necessary to create better, more sustainable communities through the positive power of business.

The Notre Dame SIFE team has just completed its first full year as a university recognized club. Lauren Sullivan, a junior Finance major, and Caitlin Nichols, a senior Psychology and Peace Studies major, served as co-presidents of ND SIFE this year. Under their leadership, the ND SIFE team did an outstanding job in both preparing and delivering an award-winning presentation at the 2011 SIFE regional competition in Chicago. The regional championship, the second consecutive for ND SIFE,

entitles the team to take part in the national competition in Minneapolis on May 10-12th. Unfortunately, the SIFE national competition is during final exam week, so the team will not be able to compete.

This year's SIFE projects included increased marketing and fundraising of two existing campus events: Bengal Bouts Boxing Tournament and the Holy Half Marathon. SIFE also created two stand-alone projects; one promoted corporate social responsibility and sustainability on campus through an employer showcase luncheon, and the second helped a local farming co-op expand its member base.

Throughout the year data and metrics were recorded about each of the projects. In March the students worked to prepare a 24-minute presentation that showcased their accomplishments. A team of eight students, made up of freshman through seniors with Business

and Arts & Letters majors, presented at the regional competition in Chicago.

Already discussing plans for next year, the ND SIFE team is looking for new project ideas as well as new corporate sponsors and partnerships. The SIFE organization encourages students to work with different corporations for feedback on projects, ways to improve business skills, and ideas for promoting sustainability in the community. The ND team is working to expand their connections with corporations by creating new partnerships that will result in an expanded Business Advisory Board, events similar to the Employer Showcase, and ideas for new projects.
