EPCH is a private non-profit 122 bed pediatric hospital offering a broad range of pediatric primary, secondary and tertiary care services to West Texas, Southeastern New Mexico and Mexico.

EPCH is a new hospital just opening it's doors for the first time in February 2012. A dream for an independent children's hospital in El Paso began over 20 years ago. After four feasibility studies and several different hospital organizations abandoning the idea of the new hospital, that finally changed. In November 2007, the voters of El Paso said "Yes!" to a children's hospital. Today that dream is coming true.

The El Paso Children's Hospital will be the largest expansion of pediatric medical services in West Texas in recent history. We will be the first separately licensed children's hospital in the El Paso Region. It is designed and created especially for kids from the ground up. Every room, from the operating room to the patient room, is designed and furnished with the comfort and the state-of-art technology to meet the needs of children and their families.

Pediatricians take care of coughs and colds; pediatric subspecialists stay in school for a few more years of training to develop special knowledge and expertise in areas such as pulmonology, cardiology, urology, and oncology. If you've ever had a seriously sick baby, you were probably sent to see a pediatric subspecialist. In El Paso, approximately half the pediatric specialties were represented and half were not. Except for in a few areas, our city had only one practicing physician in each specialty. That meant that every pediatrician was on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Eventually many of them became burned out and moved to communities where they would be better supported. It became clear that our children weren't getting the care they deserved.
