



## 2009 Summer Institute for Latino Public Policy June 15-19, 2009

### INTRODUCTION

Established in 1986, the Summer Institute for Latino Public Policy (SILPP) is an educational program for junior and senior undergraduate students enrolled in IUPLR's member institutions that combine technical and practical experience in public policy and leadership training. Every year, 30 young scholars convene in Washington, DC for an intense week of training and orientation to public policy and legislative processes through a series of seminars, workshops, site visits to national organizations and meetings with Congressional representatives.

### THE INSTITUTE

The Summer Institute for Latino Public Policy will be held at The George Washington University (GWU) in Washington, D.C. on **June 15-19, 2009**.

### Goals

- Provide an appreciation and understanding of public policy issues confronting Latinos in the U.S.
- Meet national leaders who advocate at the national level for education, health care, housing, environmental and other issues of importance to the community;
- Experience the public policy process through personal contact with public policy decision makers;
- Develop an appreciation for the legislative process;
- Present findings of an in-depth research project in current public policy issues;
- Expand critical thinking, problem solving, teamwork, interpersonal and communication skills;
- Develop, expand and enhance leadership skills.

All expenses related to the program will be covered including round-trip air and local transportation, lodging at GWU dormitories, meals and classroom materials. Participants are responsible for covering medical and travel insurance and incidental expenses.

### REQUIREMENTS

Participants who successfully complete the program requirements listed below will receive a certificate of completion.

- Attend all training sessions;

- Participate in all SILPP-sponsored activities;
- Prepare and deliver an eight (8) minute presentation, preferably using PowerPoint software, on a current public policy issue of choice based on a research project or paper. The presentation should be prepared and ready for delivery prior to arrival in Washington, D.C.;
- Comply with SILPP program policies.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Be a full-time undergraduate student enrolled in one of the IUPLR member institutions;
- Have a junior or senior standing. If senior, must graduate in December 2009. Spring semester graduating seniors are not eligible;
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (preferred, not required);
- Have demonstrated interest in public policy.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must submit a complete application form, a two-page statement stating their interest on the program; two letters of recommendation, an official transcript or letter of good academic standing and a resume.

Application Deadline: **April 17, 2009**

### ABOUT IUPLR

IUPLR is a national consortium of Latino-focused research centers, primarily university based, that promote knowledge about the Latino population.

IUPLR works to expand the pool of Latino scholars and leaders, strengthen the capacity of Latino research centers, increase the availability of policy-relevant Latino-focused research, and advance the intellectual presence of Latino scholarship nationally.
