Goals	learn html and css design considerations in designing for the internet experience in critiquing the creative work of others
Attendance	Because of the nature of studio courses, it is critical that you are at class on time and ready to work everyday. Arriving late to class three times will result in an absence. 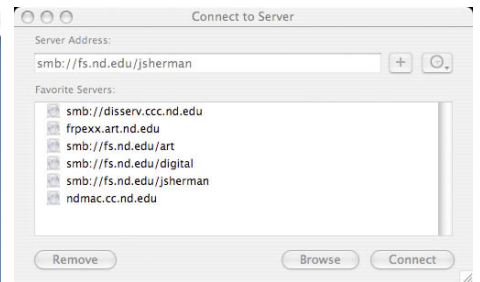
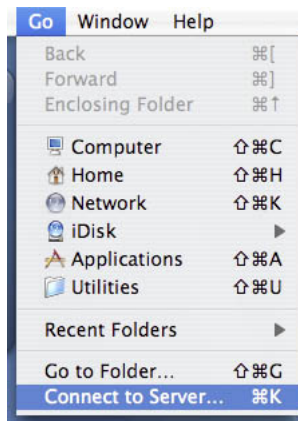

Connecting to NetFile while on campus using Mac OSX



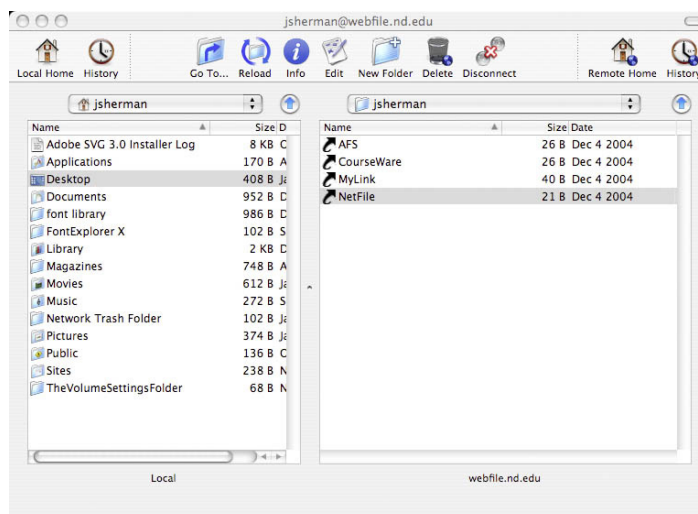
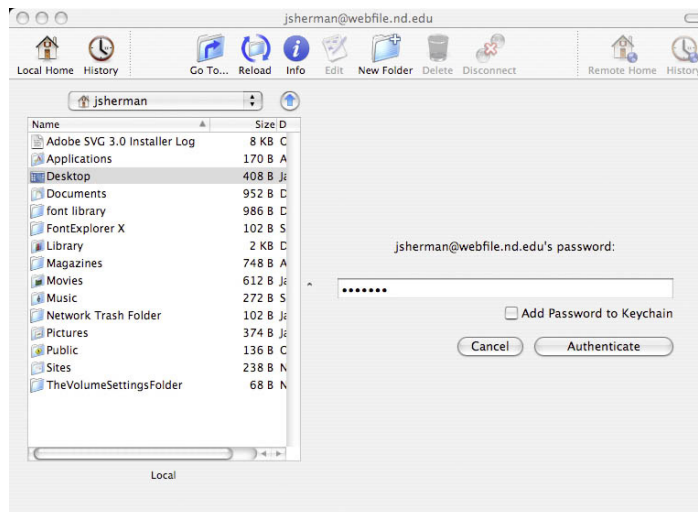
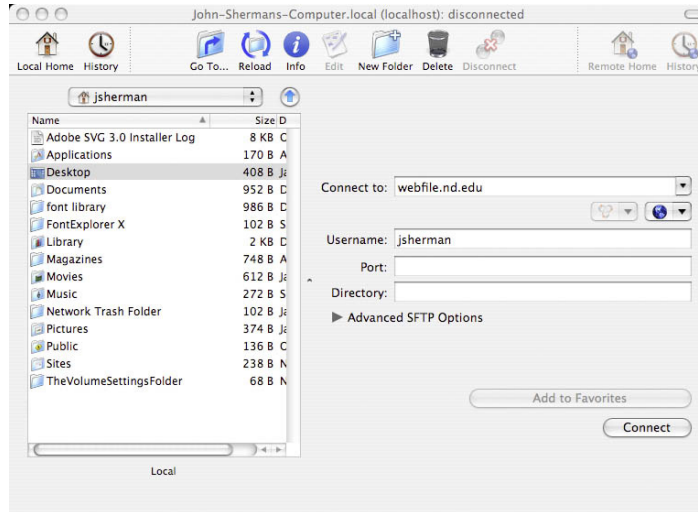
