This code section is published in the 2000 edition of U.S.C., but an amended subsection is contained in the 2004 cumulative annual supplement (Supp. IV) to the 2000 edition. To cite the entire section:

24 U.S.C. § 421 (2000 & Supp. V 2005).

A 2002 amendment completely replaced the language found in the 2000 edition of U.S.C. The amendment can be found in the 2004 cumulative annual supplement (Supp. IV) to the 2000 edition.

25 U.S.C. § 1484 (Supp. V 2005).

This code section appears in the bound volumes of the unofficial codes. However, a 2006 amendment to certain subsections is only available in the pocket parts of the unofficial codes. The new amendments are too recent to appear in the official U.S.C., so you must cite an unofficial code.
