Abstract: In Turkish Law, working permits of foreigners has been regulated in the Law No. 4817 on the Work Permits of Aliens. Any foreigner, who completes the procedure and covers the requirements stated in the Law No. 4817, may work legally in Turkey. Depending on various reasons, some foreigners work illegally in Turkey and this situation poses the increasing problem of illegal foreign workers. Turkey has specified the Law No. 4817 of 27 February 2003 on Work Permits of Aliens, in the legislation which needs to be amended in order to achieve harmonization with the *acquis communautaire*. Although, illegal foreign worker phenomenon is a multidisciplinary issue and shall not be eradicated only by the amendments which will take place, but it is still important to highlight the current situation of the Law on Work Permits of Aliens.

Abstract: Although the Turkish Labor Code has recently been changed, the scope of employment protection for workers remains limited. The three categories of termination and the reasoning, procedure, and restrictions are discussed: termination through a term of notice, just cause termination, and unfair dismissal. The most recent innovation in Turkish employment protection was the employer's need to provide a valid reason for termination, those are reasons arising from the employee, from the needs of the company itself, and as a last resort for the company. The results of the termination are introduced, being that of the reinstatement of the worker if the termination is unjustified, compensations and payments instead of reinstatement, and unemployment benefits from the government. There now are new laws in place that prevent collective dismissals without 30-day prior notice given. With the change in the economy and increasing unemployment rates, the Turkish state has reached out and increased the workers' protection and rights through the ratification of increased codes; however, the practical result still remains to be seen.
