

# Locating a book, report, or essay in a book

*At Law Library?*



Search **LINK** – unless absolutely certain of title, use keyword search

*At other ND libraries?*



Search **Main Library catalog** – title keyword best if any doubt about title

*On web?*



Search **GOOGLE** – might find PDF version (or web might be the only source)

*Available ILL?*



Search **WORLDCAT** – keyword best unless certain of title; if record found, do ILL request

*Still no luck?*



Search **full-text law review on WL or LX** -- compare footnote(s) citing same source to check spelling of author's name and exact title. Once discrepancy identified, start process above over again.

*Give up?*

# Locating a journal article

*Available in PDF?*



- A. For legal journals check **HeinOnline**
- B. If non-legal journal, try Main Library's **e-Journal Locator**

*Print journal available at ND?*



- A. Search **LINK** for journal (*not* article) title – unless absolutely certain of title, use keyword search and limit Publication to Serials (Journals, Newspapers, etc.)
- B. Search **Main Library catalog** – use “**All Journals**” link under **e-Journals** tab

*On the web?*



Search **GOOGLE** – might find PDF version (or web might be the only source)

*Available ILL?*



Search **WORLDCAT** – keyword best unless certain of title; if record found, do ILL request

*Still no luck?*



Use an index to check accuracy of citation. Or search **full-text law review on WL or LX** – compare footnote(s) citing same source to check spelling of author's name and exact title. Once discrepancy identified, start process above over again.

*Give up?*
