Good news for May 2005 MBA grads

As business school graduations approach, we continue to receive good news from the latest *Manpower Employment Outlook Survey*. Of the 16,000 U.S. employers surveyed, 30 percent plan to add staff in Q2 while only seven percent plan to cut payrolls. Additionally, Q2 over Q1 hiring estimates appear to be similar over the ten industry sectors surveyed. As previously reported by Manpower, employer estimates of new job opportunities seem to be brightest in the west and the most conservative in the northeast.

Experts Gather for 'Latin America in the Global Economy' Conference

U.S. and international experts on the Latin American economy will gather for a daylong conference on "Latin America in the Global Economy" at the Hesburgh Center Auditorium on Tuesday, April 19.

The conference, sponsored by the Kellogg Institute for International Studies, will address Latin America's economic challenges, discuss the imperative to raise productivity growth, and propose next steps on the region's path to overcome the economic burden of the past.
