

**SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES
FOR LONDON PROGRAMME STUDENTS
2009-2010**

1. The *John Bruce Dodds Memorial Scholarship* was established by his classmates, colleagues, family and friends. The criteria considered for the Scholarship are need, merit, and a commitment and determination reminiscent of that shown by Bruce Dodds.

Bruce studied in London during the 1978-79 academic year and graduated from Notre Dame Law School in 1980. Before Law School, Bruce attended the United States Air Force Academy, where doctors discovered a cancerous growth in his hip joint which required the amputation of his leg. Following Law School, Bruce joined the Fulbright & Jaworski firm in Houston. Sadly, the malignancy recurred; and Bruce died in 1983. Even with his physical adversity, Bruce took the fullest advantage of all that the Law School had to offer, and he was greatly admired by all. He considered his year in London the highlight of his Law School experience.

2. The *Harry M. Bainbridge Memorial Scholarship* was established by his classmates, colleagues, family, friends, and employer -- PEPSICO. The selection criteria for the Scholarship include need, merit, and a particular interest in and facility for the area of International Law.

Harry studied in the London Law Programme in the 1978-79 Academic Year and graduated from Notre Dame Law School in 1980. Following Law School, Harry served as an international lawyer for PEPSICO. He was returning from a PEPSICO assignment to be with his family for Christmas when he died when PAN AM Flight 103 crashed as the result of a terrorist bombing over Lockerbie, Scotland, in 1988. He is survived by his widow and son, Harry, Jr.

3. The *Clive Schmitthoff Memorial Scholarship* was established by a bequest from the late Professor Schmitthoff, who taught in the London Programme for a number of years. The selection criteria include need and merit.

Professor Schmitthoff was one of the most distinguished commercial lawyers, and teachers, of the second half of the twentieth century. His treatise on international commercial law remains a classic. His commitment to his students, and to Notre Dame students in particular, was without reservation.
