

Ltd. Col. Kelly Jordan, ROTC University of Notre Dame



Lieutenant Colonel Kelly C. Jordan currently serves as the Professor of Military Science and as the Battalion Commander for the US Army ROTC “Fightin’ Irish” Battalion at the University of Notre Dame, where he also holds a concurrent appointment as an Assistant Professor of History. He earned a bachelor’s degree in history from the Virginia Military Institute, and a master’s degree and doctorate in military history from the Ohio State University. Previously he served as an instructor at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College in the Combined Arms and Services Staff School, and he taught Military History at the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. During the course of his military career, he has participated in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, Operation Hurricane Andrew Relief, and he served for eighteen months in the Republic of Korea near the DMZ. He is a graduate of the Army’s Airborne and Ranger schools, and the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. He has received numerous teaching and writing awards, is the author of several articles, and is working on preparing his Ph.D. dissertation on the combat effectiveness of the Eighth Army in Korea for publication.
