

Course Registration information for the SSLP

THEO 33936: Confronting Social Issues

The SSLP course (THEO 33936) is listed as a fall semester course, even though you complete much of the course work in the summer.

- It is best to sign up for all your other courses first in case the SSLP course puts you in an overload of credit hours (see below for instructions in the event of an overload).
- It is your responsibility to register for THEO 33936 (CRN 12373), Summer Service Learning: Confronting Social Issues.

Directed Readings for Second –time SSLP Students: If you are doing a Directed Readings course in place of THEO 33936, ask the professor with whom you are working how to sign up for a Directed Readings or Special Studies course in the department. This course *replaces* the standard SSLP course, THEO 33936.

Overload of credit hours: If the SSLP puts you in an overload of credit hours, you will need to get permission from your Dean to register for the course.

- Do not sign up for more than 21 hours including the SSLP.
- Permission for an overload of credit hours is not given until the fall semester.
- For students in the College of Arts and Letters, we will submit your names to the Dean's Office in the summer and they will enter you into the course.
- For students in other colleges, you will need to go to your Dean's office within the first week of the fall semester to get permission and then register for the course.

We will remind you of all of this in the fall. Again, this is just if the SSLP course puts you in the situation of an overload of credit hours.

Discipleship Course: THEO 20625 (CRN14769) If you are interested in taking the additional three-credit course in the fall semester, Discipleship: Loving Action for Justice, taught by Prof. Margaret Pfeil, this course does count as a second required Theology course. It is only open to students who have completed a summer service immersion and is a great opportunity to study in more depth the issues that arise over the summer. The prerequisite for this course is the Foundations course, the first required theology course – there are no exceptions. Study Abroad Students: You need to sign up for the course in the semester that you return to campus.

- For those going abroad in the fall semester, you will take the course in the spring semester. We will offer the three facilitated small groups over three weeks, but not the day-long workshop.
- For those going abroad for a year, you will join the 2012 students when you return and have the option of the day-long workshop or three discussion sessions over three weeks.
