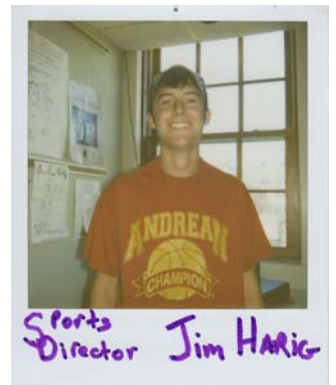

Spiders and Mainland China.

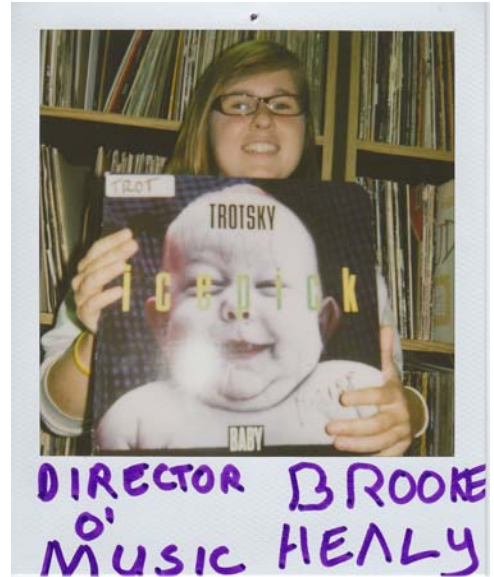
Creepily accurate. Any final thoughts?

Graphics Director

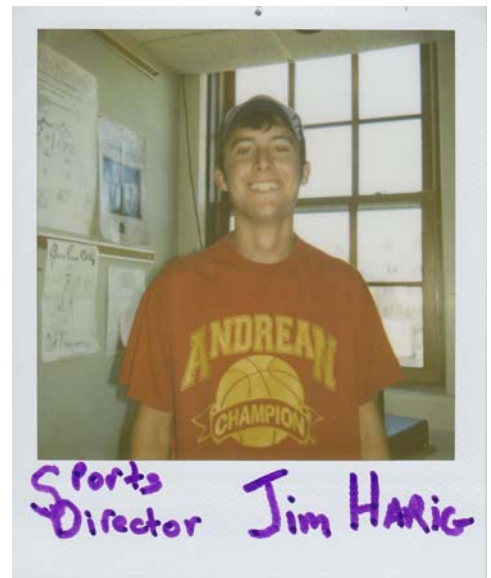
